CHRISTIAN COMMUNITIES GROUP HOMES CELEBRATES 30TH ANNIVERSARY

Open House and program to Raise Awareness about Homelessness on October 15th

Washington, DC (October 6, 2011): Local non-profit Christian Communities Group Homes (CCGH) will celebrate its 30th year of service to the Washington community on Saturday, October 15th at noon with an Open House. The event will take place from 12 – 2 and include refreshments, entertainment, and free Zumba fitness demonstrations. The Open House will be held at 2501 18th Street NE (one mile from Rhode Island Avenue Metro.) In case of rain, the event will be held at the Washington Center for Aging Services, 2601 18th St. NE.

Attendees also have the opportunity to become a Fannie Mae Help the Homeless participant at the Open House. CCGH is a beneficiary of Fannie Mae's Help the Homeless Program which raises funds to support organizations working to prevent and end homelessness in the Washington metropolitan area. Mini-walks increase the awareness about the issue of homelessness while raising much needed funds.

CCGH operates 3 homes for formerly homeless older adults. Seniors live either in a communal home, sharing kitchen, living and dining spaces or, those who are more frail live in a supportive environment with 24-hour supervision. CCGH also has a vibrant volunteer program. For nearly two decades, Age-In-Place has offered free basic housing services such as yard work and house cleaning to more than 500 seniors so that they may remain more safely and comfortably in their homes and neighborhoods.

CCGH and Age-In-Place are subsidiaries of Seabury Resources for Aging, an 88 year old Washington non-profit which offers personalized, affordable services and housing options to help older adults in the greater Washington, DC area live with independence and dignity.
